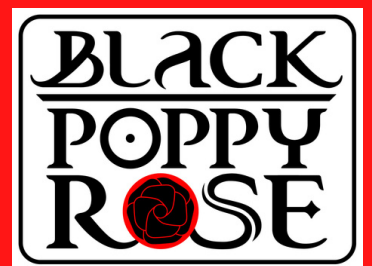
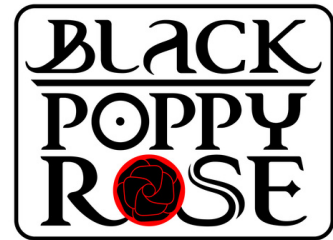




School Workshops

How we do this: (One Lesson)

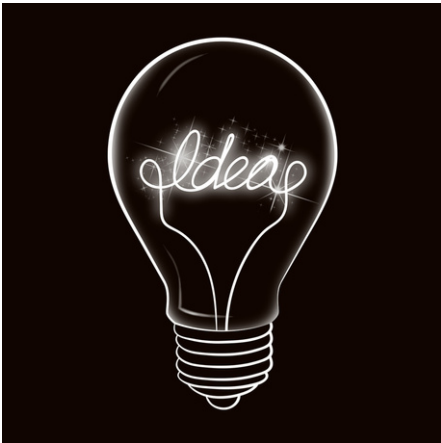
- 15 minute presentation

You are at the start of History. Starting from your year of birth, we build the world's history around you.

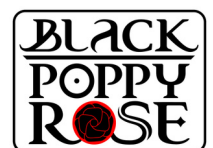
- What did the world look like before you were born?

- How will you impact change for tomorrow?

Self Identity and belonging are very important.

Our workshop aims:

- Create a timeline from 2021 - 1901
- Include 5 key events within 120 years
- Include each student and two generations of their families.
- Learn Chronological orders of time
- Explore the seven continents of the world
- Learn the dates from World 1 and 2

Create your Timeline



Creating your timeline is about understanding the students connection to History.

By establishing a personal base, we are able to expand on the students capacity to think whilst exploring their thoughts and concepts most relevant to their life experiences.

The we information share is designed to open their minds to ask questions to make sense of areas they do not feel are right/equal or fair, looking at solutions they feel would be suitable .

(We have found this method to work very very well.)

Family is at the start of all things. In 2021 we explore the differences behind this term so all students are proud of their family structures.

(We do our best to support children who have lost a parent or both)

Write a Letter Home

Whether from the battlefields or from home, what would you want to share with your loved ones about your experiences, thoughts and feelings?

- What do you want to say?
- What do you want them to hear?
- What do you want them to remember?

Self expression is very important.

Our workshop aims:

- Inclusion of dates & location
- Learn Chronological orders of time
- Explore two.three continents
- Create a visual image to accompany the letter

The workshops are extremely interactive, allowing all students to engage and reveal their abilities to express themselves using words and images.



Write a Letter Home

Writing a letter home, is about processing emotional thoughts to create a letter to show your support/feeling towards someone you care about, who is far away as you may not see for a long time or ever again.

Letter/Diary writing are key methods of expressing thoughts and feelings that may not be verbalise. We all do not have the same thoughts and do not express them in the same ways. This workshop explores the students use of the English language and how will they command their own expression.

(Ideal for teachers to access in which ways to support each individual to reach their highest potential.)

Expressing yourself is something difficult if you cannot find the words to suit your emotions and thoughts. Working what what you have is how we start anything. Relationship building is an essential part of life. The one we have with ourselves relates to how we receive or are received by others.

Self expression comes in many forms and explore two areas within this workshop, written and pictorial.
